• The aim is to visit the various buildings of the IPS schools to raise awareness among the public of the various organizational units.





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The implementation of the project involved different stages:






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Reusing and repurposing have much more impactful/immediate effects, both economically and in terms of sustainability than recycling, which involves a process of transformation.


Every year 79 billion litres of water are consumed, 190,000 tonnes of microplastics are released, and 92 million tonnes of textile waste are dumped in landfills (Lee and Weder; 2021).

"From the perspective of European consumption, textiles have, on average, the fourth highest negative lifecycle impact on the environment and climate change, after food, housing and mobility (EEA, 2022c).

Europeans consume on average 14,8 kilograms of textiles per person per year.

At the same time, Europeans also discard textiles, and a large proportion of the collected used textiles are sold on the global market (Watson et al., 2016)."
