Title: Becoming a Better Neighbour – Community Outreach by Irish campuses

- Green Campus committee as conduit between a third level institution and the local and wider community
- Links to the Seven Steps of Green Campus particularly Step 6 of the programme: 'Informing and Involving the Campus and Wider Community'

Through Step 6: A Green Campus Committee is empowered to:

- Reach out to their local community and work in partnership to address threats to the local environment
- Promote environmental citizenship and social inclusion
- Work on community enhancement projects
- Pass on experience and best practice
- Seek opportunities to co-learn and cocreate
- Set an example in the locality and to become, in essence, a better neighbour.



Green-Campus Origins to Present Day

- Origins: UCC students in 2007 saw the need for follow on from Green-Schools. They Celebrated 10 Years as an awarded campus in 2020 and recently were awarded their 5th green flag.
- 2024: 60 registered, 22 awarded Green-Campus Accreditation
- Both a programme and an award, does not aim to reward specific environmental improvement projects, e.g. switching to renewable energy or capital projects
- Criteria: the successful implementation of the seven steps of the programme and a demonstration of commitment to the continuity of the programme on campus
- Long term commitment to environmental action and improvement on campus (Assessment & Renewal)

- **Dublin City University:** A multi-campus university in North Dublin established in 1989, first green flag in 2014, 18k students and 2.5k staff:
- DCU goes Wild for Cruinniú na nÓg (youth meeting)
 exploring creative ways to make room for nature in the city on the All Hallows Campus
- Connection to a wider national initiative by Creative Ireland



Dublin City University Community Outreach

 In October 2022, Ireland held its first Children and Young People's Assembly on Biodiversity Loss.

Key features

- Brought together a representative random sample of 35 children and young aged 7-17 from across Ireland
- Met over 2 weekends in October 2022
- Created a vision statement, 6 key messages, and 58 calls to action on biodiversity protection





University College Cork Community Outreach

- University College Cork: Cork City campus, established in 1845, founding member of the Green Campus programme and now on 5th green flag, 23k students and 3k staff
- Cork Nature Forum: founded as a local coalition for biodiversity.
- The **core aims** of the Nature Forum are to advocate for the conservation, enhancement, and addition of blue and green spaces and their associated biodiversity in Cork City and further afield.
- The Forum is **non-hierarchical** and meets every month. Members include representatives Cork City Council, Cork Environmental Forum, UCC (students and staff), Green Spaces for Health, LAWPRO, amongst others.




University College Cork Community Outreach

- BehaviAir (Behaviour and Impacts on Air Quality) is a collaboration between academics in UCC (School of Applied Psychology, School of Chemistry), Cork City Council and Cork Healthy Cities.
- The project builds on ongoing research and engagement work by this group of partners in Cork to enhance public awareness of air pollution (which is currently limited) through effective communication and air quality data, and use this to promote positive behaviours for healthy air





TU Dublin Community Outreach

- Technological University Dublin: Formed in 2019, multi campus location in Dublin City and suburbs, first green flag in 2023, 28k students and 2.5k staff
- CRAWL Campus' Role as Actors in Walkable and Liveable Communities
- CRAWL aims to engage TU Dublin's community and campus stakeholders in order to understand barriers and provide opportunities to make campuses and their surrounding neighbourhoods more walkable and liveable.

TU Dublin Community Outreach

- The 'GLAS @ TU Dublin' garden provides a space for local community groups and schools to grow fresh produce, reconnect with nature, and foster a stronger sense of community.
- The garden opened in May 2023, and welcomes people of all ages, backgrounds and abilities.
- <u>New research</u> published ahead of 'National Allotments and Community Gardens Week 2023' underlines the critical importance of green spaces for urban communities




Kinsale College Community Outreach

- The Patchwork Meadow Project
- Following on from the success of preparing meadows in local primary schools in 2023, Kinsale College are now expanding their Patchwork Meadow project from schools to the entire community with the goal is to engage all local school children to plant a 1x1m meadow patch as part of a larger mission to regenerate local ecosystems.

ATU Connemara Community Outreach

- Atlantic Technological University Connemara:
 Technological University in rural Galway specialising in furniture design, established in 1987, on 2nd green flag, 200 students
- A Community Native Woodland was planted in 2013 at the Letterfrack, Connemara campus of Galway-Mayo Institute of Technology (now part of the Atlantic Technological University).
- The woodland planting was a collaboration with the campus, Connemara National Park (CNP), Connemara West campus and local community groups.
- The woodland project was planned by the GMIT Letterfrack Green Campus Committee with support from the 'One Million Trees and a Day' initiative and a Department of Agriculture Native Woodland grant.
- The woodland planting was undertaken to provide a learning environment for students and staff of the nearby GMIT Letterfrack campus (now ATU Connemara), as well as diversifying habitat for biodiversity gain within the CNP and to contribute to carbon sequestration.
