Part of Qatar Foundation


CMU-Q is a proud member of the Qatar Foundation, a leading organization dedicated to education, research, and community development.

High Emissions

Doha, Qatar is one of the biggest emitters of greenhouse gases in the world.

Extreme Heat

Doha experiences extremely hot summers, reaching 40-50°C, leading to high air conditioning usage and limited outdoor activity.

Lack of walking

Due to the hot climate, there is little walking in Doha, as people rely heavily on cars and air conditioning.






Wellness

- Spending time in nature, physical activities, and outside of the classrooms
















Eco-Expeditions: A Global Perspective

Essay Questions

All applicants had to undergo a blind application process and answer three essay questions. Ecocampus members selected the finalists, and the Global Learning Committee matched for preference and diversity.

Pre Departure Sessions

Five pre-departure sessions leading up to the trip included learning about 1.5 degrees C, global warming impacts, doing an awareness campaign, ideation for future Ecocampus projects.

Daily Reflections

During the trip, there are daily reflections and discussion questions to help process what is learned.

Post Departure Sessions & Project

Upon return, there is both a survey understanding what the students learnt and a dedication to one year working on a project based on what they learned: what will they bring back to campus?
